

Grands Crus

The Grand Cru classification is not new to our region.



Indeed, the municipality of Salgesch was the first in Valais to introduce the requirements of a Grand Cru label for its **Pinot Noir**. That was in 1988.

It was quickly followed (in 1993) by the municipality of St-Léonard, which labelled its **Chasselas** and **Pinot Noir** in the same way.

In 2015, and because of its larger area, the region of Sierre joined the classification, accompanied by some of the neighbouring municipalities (Crans-Montana, Lens, Miège, Venthône and Veyras).

Grand Cru Salgesch – since 1988

Grape variety concerned: **Pinot Noir**.

Grand Cru de Saint-Léonard – since 1993

Grape varieties concerned: **Chasselas (Fendant)** and **Pinot Noir**.

Sierre Grand Cru – since 2015

Grape varieties concerned: **Marsanne Blanche, Petite Arvine, Cornalin** and **Syrah**.

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
